You've registered an account with the site before, so we'll have you log in using the username and password on this sheet.

# Scenario 3 (Student): Job Search, Mentor Invitation, Job Application

# Show participant computer screen on 'Your Profile' page.

Take a few moments to look at the page. You can use the mouse to scroll, but don't click on anything just yet. You can disregard the inactive links to LinkedIn, GitHub, and 'Website.' From your employer perspective, what are your first impressions? What do you think you can do here, and what might you do next?

Why do you say that? What makes you feel that way?

Okay, thank you for that. Now, as the employer looking for someone to work on a project, what would you want to do next?

(Or, refer to the last question: You had mentioned that you'd want to put your project on the site, so let's do that next.)

Okay, since you have a project you want to hire help for, let's create a post for it using the details I've provided for you. Could you show me how you might go about that? Feel free to speak your thoughts aloud as you make and post your job.

(Participant moves through posting of job using Supplemental Info.)

(Participant selects 'Submit.' As the following two questions are asked, Hidden team member, logged in as Student, locates participant's job posting and applies using "Supplemental Info #2".)

Is there anything missing that you think is important at this step in the client's process?

Thank you for sharing those thoughts with us. As a client, you're eager to get your project off the ground. Some time has passed since posting your job. What might you want to do next?

Great, you'd probably want to see who responded to your post. Allow me just a moment to apply to your posting as a student. How might you go about seeing any responses?

Participant should eventually navigate to 'My Jobs' and 'Pending Hire.'

What are your initial thoughts here? What would you want to do next?

Okay, it looks like your job posting has caught the eye of a student. Let's go ahead and take a closer look at them.

Participant should eventually navigate to 'Job Details' and 'Applicant Details.'

Spending some time on this page, what are your thoughts? As a client reviewing a potential hire, is there anything missing here, or any changes that you'd want to see?

How would those additions or changes be helpful to you?

Great, thanks for that feedback. Now let's say that this student meets your project needs and you'd like to hire them. Go ahead and do that now.

Participant should select 'Hire.' 'Are you sure you want to hire this applicant' window appears.

What are your thoughts at this stage? How are you feeling about the hiring process so far?

Okay, now that you've hired a student for your project, what might you want to do next?

Great, let's say you want to message the student regarding your project to get them started. Let's go ahead and compose a message to the applicant- how might you go about doing this? Participant should eventually navigate to 'Messages.'

As a client using this message platform, what are your thoughts?

Is there anything missing from this space that you'd like to see? Why?

Great, thank you for that. We're just about done here, but before we wrap up, do you have any other thoughts or questions?

Thanks so much for that feedback. That's all I have for you, thanks for taking the time to answer these questions for us!

# SCENARIOS FOR MENTOR ROLE

# Scenario 1 (Mentor): Account Creation

You'll be assuming the role of an established professional who wants to use SkillSense to mentor less-experienced tech practitioners.

What kinds of instances have you had mentoring less-experienced practitioners in the past? Tell me a little about them.

Have you also experienced being the mentee before, whether in a formal or informal context? If so, what impressions did that experience leave you with?

In either scenario, how did you go about connecting with your mentor or mentee?

Let's begin by clicking on the link to the website. What are your initial thoughts or impressions about the site? Excellent. Now I'd like you to register for an account using the information on the sheet I've given you.

Please try to think aloud as much as possible as you go through the onboarding process. You can draw from your own professional background, or make up the information. You can also disregard the LinkedIn, Github, and Website portions of the account for now.

Hidden team member logs in as ADMIN and approves mentor.

Now that you're registered, what do you think will happen next?
